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Financial Simulations:

Kids Marketplace

Kid's Marketplace is a hands-on simulation used to introduce elementary students to financial choices.

Students learn how to:

- Make financial decisions
- Understand the difference between needs and wants
- Recognize the importance of math skills in everyday life

Reality Store

During this hands-on experience students randomly select a hypothetical family. Based on that family's income they make spending decisions for their household for a month.

Reality Store is designed to:

- Give youth a glimpse of "their" future
- Help youth become aware of the need for financial planning, decision making, and goal setting
- Motivate youth to examine attitudes about their future careers
- Motivate youth to stay in school

Poverty Simulation

Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed (ALICE), is the population of people who work and earn above the federal poverty level, but not enough to afford a basic household budget. The success of communities is directly tied to the **financial stability** of ALICE households. After participating in the simulation, you can expect to have more knowledge about the financial stress of this population and may be inspired to improve the culture within your organization and/or community.

Target audience: Administrators, City councils, Leadership Councils, Educators, Medical Personnel, Law Enforcement, Recreational Administrators, Financial Institutions, Clergy.
